Over the past year, Katz and his colleagues have been implementing the MVP Model in the Jefferson County, Colorado school district, including Columbine High School. Katz is the creator of an award-winning new educational video for college and high school students, entitled "Tough Guise: Violence, Media, and the Crisis in Masculinity." He has published several academic articles on subjects including working with student-athletes in gender violence prevention, juvenile detention, violent white masculinity in advertising, and men's leadership in gender violence prevention education K-12.

A former three-sport high school athlete and all-star football player, Katz was the first man at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst to earn a minor in women's studies. He holds a masters degree from the Harvard Graduate School of Education. Since 1990, he has lectured at over 500 colleges, prep schools, high schools, middle schools, professional conferences and military installations in 41 states."
